

Mezuza Protection Power Hunt

15 Minutes



Instructions:

- **1.** Cut out all the Mezuzot from the Mezuzah hunt file.
- 2. Choose a room or outside area to have a Mezuzah hunt.
- 3. Have an adult spread the cut out Mezuzot all over the Mezuzah hunt area when you are out of eyesight.

Variation: Play with a partner:

 Option 1: Compete with a partner in the same Mezuzah hunt to see who can collect the most Mezuzot.

- Option 2: Each partner will choose a different Mezuzah hunt area and hide the Mezuzot from the other. Continue with instructions below.
- 4. When the hunt is set up, go to the Mezuzah hunt area and set a timer for 90 seconds. Collect as many Mezuzot as you can before the timer goes off!
- **5.** Count how many Mezuzot you collected. How many did you find?
- 6. Create a beautiful collage on the protective gear collage file by glueing the Mezuzot you found inside the protective gear.
- 7. Just like wearing protective gear keeps our bodies safe, a Mezuzah on our front door protects our home and all those inside!

Think About It

A real Mezuza on a door gives us real power - protection

for our homes and those inside of them. Do you have a Mezuza on all the doors in your home?

DIY Judaica

Kotel Mezuzah Case

20 Minutes



Instructions:

- Paint your wooden Mezuzah case brown, or another color of your choice.
- 2. Once it's dry, arrange the wooden "stones" on your Mezuzah case. Alternate the direction of each row of stones. When you're happy with their placement, glue the stones into position.



- 3. Glue the silhouette of the praying person on the bottom of your Mezuzah, and add some "moss" between some stones for a realistic Kotel look!.
- 4. With your parents help, insert a real Mezuzah scroll into the case, and follow the instructions in the Mezuzah placement guide to properly affix it to your door frame!



Think About It

Having a Mezuza on all our doorways

is a special Mitzvah in the Torah. It reminds us to act as proud Jews both inside and outside of our homes! Inside the Mezuza is a special scroll that contains the words of the Shema prayer. While anyone can decorate the case that holds the Mezuza, only a certified scribe can write a real Mezuza. Contact your local Chabad to find out how you can get a Mezuza scroll of your own!

Pasta Art Part 1

15 minutes



Instructions:

Pasta Dye:

- **1.** Divide the dried pasta into ziploc bags, about 1 cup of pasta per bag. Each bag will be mixed into a separate color.
- **2.** Add a teaspoon or so of vinegar to each bag.
- **3.** Close the bags and carefully mix the vinegar into the pasta by massaging the outside of the bag.
- **4.** One at a time, open each bag and add a generous squeeze of food coloring or liquid watercolor paint. Close the bag again and carefully mix the color into the pasta by massaging the outside of the bag.
- **5.** Let sit for 10-15 minutes.
- **6.** Spread the pasta out flat on the paper towel lined trays, being careful to keep each color separated from the one next to it.
- 7. Let dry for 2-3 hours.

Pasta Art Part 2




ART OPTION 1: PASTA NECKLACE

AGES 4-6 | (1) 15 MINUTES

Instructions:

- 1. Ask an adult to help tie one piece of colored pasta onto the end of the yarn, this will stop the pasta from slipping off.
- 2. Thread the colored pasta onto the yarn. You can choose to use a random order or make a pattern.
- 3. When your string is full of pasta, ask an adult to help un-tie that first piece of pasta, and knot both ends of the yarn together. Now your beautiful pasta necklace is ready for you to wear!



ART OPTION 2: PASTA MOSAIC ART

AGES 7-12 | (1) 15 MINUTES

Instructions:

- **4.** Cut the white cardstock into whatever size and shape you'd like your mosaic to be.
 - Ex: square, circle, triangle, rectangle
- 5. Trace your white cardstock shape onto the cardboard and cut it out to be the same size.
- **6.** Glue the white cardstock onto the cardboard, this will give your mosaic piece a strong backing.
- 7. Arrange your colored pasta pieces out from the center, and feel free to play around with them before you glue them down.

Tip: Pour some glue onto a plate and use a wooden skewer or q-tip to dab small amounts of glue at a time to make your mosaic much neater.

Cupcake Wars

20 Minutes



Instructions:

- **1.** Set up your cupcake decorating area.
 - Place one cupcake on each plate, and set up the icing and toppings in a neat order.
- 2. If using piping bags and decorating tips, fill the bags with icing so you'll be ready to begin decorating. Snip off a small tip of the piping bag and place the decorating tip in the bottom of the bag. Fold the bag at least halfway down over your hand. Using your other hand fill the bag with icing and press it down into the bag. Tie it with a rubber band.
- 3. In this game, there will be 2 rounds of cupcake war decorating. Each round will have a different challenge for you to follow. You can decorate your cupcake however you'd like. Spread icing on it, place your

toppings in a creative pattern or shape, you can even put some filling inside!

Round 1: Color Round

4. Choose a color and decorate one cupcake entirely in that color. Be sure to use at least 3 different ingredients to decorate the cupcake. Get creative!

Round 2: Artistic Round

- 5. Frost and decorate one cupcake to be as beautiful as can be. Each cupcake will be judged on its creativity and overall artistic presentation.
- 6. After you decorate each cupcake, set it aside for the judge's presentation. You will present each round of cupcake to the judge and explain the flavors and decorations you used on each cupcake. For each round, the judges will rate the cupcakes from 1-10 and explain the score. Best of luck!

Pin the Mezuzah on the Doorway

(1) 15 Minutes



Instructions:

- 1. Hang up the printed doorway on the wall.
- **2.** Cut out the Mezuzot.
- **3.** Stick a piece of sticky tack, or double sided tape on the back of each Mezuzah.
- **4.** Take 3 big steps back from the wall that the printed doorway is hanging from.
- **5.** Hold the printed Mezuzot in your hand and cover your eyes with a blindfold.
- **6.** Turn around in a circle 5 times
- 7. Try to stick the Mezuza on to the right place on the doorway!
- 8. Repeat steps 4-7 until you get it in the right spot!

A Kosher Mezuza needs to be placed on the right spot of the doorways in our homes. Can you pin the Mezuza on the doorway?




Magnet Fishing

20 Minutes



Instructions:

1. If using regular paper, cut it into a square shape. First you fold it into a triangle, then you cut off the extra end. (If using origami paper, skip this step)





Magnet Fishing (continued)

- **3.** Decorate your fish using markers. Add eyes, fins and scales- get creative!
- **4.** Repeat steps 1-3 to create 10 fish for the "magnet aquarium".
- 5. Place a paperclip on each paper fish. Make sure they are clipped on securely and won't fall off.
- **6.** Set up all 10 fish on a flat surface area, this will be the "fishing pond".
- **7.** Tie one end of a string to the wooden rod or stick.
- **8.** Tie a magnet to the other end of the string.

Play by yourself:

- Set your bucket a short distance from the fishing pond. You may not move the bucket during the game.
- Begin "fishing" with your magnet rod.
- You may only use the magnet rods to catch the fish. Once a fish is caught and is hanging over your bucket, you may use your hand to remove it from the magnet and place it inside the bucket.
- You can make this more challenging by setting a record breaking time for how long it takes you to catch all the fish in the pond!

Try placing the paperclips in different parts of the fish. Is it easier to catch them in some areas more than others?

Play with a partner:

- Each partner will need their own magnet rod (see steps 6-7) and bucket.
- Set your buckets equally distanced from the fishing pond. You may not move the bucket during the game.
- Set a start signal for both you and your partner to begin "fishing" with your magnet rods.
- You may only use the magnet rods to catch the fish. Once a fish is caught and hanging over your bucket, you may use your hand to remove it from the magnet and place it inside the bucket.
- The player who catches the most fish in their bucket is the winner!
- You can make this more challenging by creating and adding more fish to the "pond".
- Try placing the paperclips in different parts of the fish. Is it easier to catch them in some areas more than others?

Shema Card & Frame Craft

Instructions:

- 1. Glue the Shema prayer to the frame.
- 2. Decorate the frame with stickers and foam letters.
- 3. Pull the string through the hole and knot it.
- **4.** Hang your new Shema board on the wall and use it to say Shema every day!

OVERVIEW

Both the Mezuza and Tefillin have a scroll with the same Jewish prayer inside - the Shema! The Shema is a sacred prayer which announces that there is one G-D. We say this prayer each morning, and before going to sleep each evening. Create and decorate a special Shema board that you can use each day when you say this prayer.

Instructions:

- **1.** Using the white crayon, draw a picture on the paper. Don't worry if you can't see it. (see figure 1)
- **2.** Use your paintbrush and watercolors to paint over the whole paper. Make it colorful! (see figure 2)
- **3.** Let it dry and your hidden picture will be revealed! (see figure 3)



What's Happening?

Crayons are made from wax. The wax protects the paper from liquid, so the paint won't stick to it.

OVERVIEW

- 2 Tablespoons Baking Soda
- 2 Tablespoons Water
- Dark Colored Juice (grape, cranberry)
- White Paper
- Small Bowl
- Q-tips
- Paint Brush or Cotton ball

Instructions:

- **1.** In a bowl, mix the baking soda and water. Mix it well. (See figure 1)
- **2.** Using a Q-tip write your secret message on the paper. (*See figure 2*)
- **3.** Let it dry completely. (see figure 3)
- **4.** To reveal the secret message, dip your cotton ball or paint brush into the dark colored juice. Then gently "paint" over your message and it will appear! (See figure 4&5)



What's Happening?

The baking soda, a base, reacts with the grape juice, an acid, that makes it change colors on the paper.

Instructions:

- 1. Open the Babylon Slideshow on your computer.
- **2.** The slideshow is set up to alternate between a coded babble-on message and answer.

Solar Oven S'mores


20 Minutes




Instructions:

1. Cut the "oven door" flap on the box.

With adult help, cut a three-sided flap out of the top side of the box, leaving at least a 1-inch border around the three sides.



2. Glue or tape aluminum foil to the inside of the "oven door". Make sure the foil is as flat and smooth as possible, like a mirror. The foil will reflect the sun into the oven.



OVERVIEW

Use the power of the sun to make delicious S'mores in your very own solar oven!

SUPPLIES NEEDED

- Cardboard box with attached lid. Box should be at least 3 inches deep. (shoebox or pizza box works well)
- Clear plastic wrap or 2 sheets of clear sheet protectors
- Aluminum foil
- Black paper
- Tape or Glue
- Wooden stick (skewer, ruler, or pencil)
- Scissors or Xacto knife

Ingredients for S'mores:

- graham crackers,
- iumbo marshmallows
- chocolate



Solar Oven S'mores

Continued

3. Glue or tape two layers of plastic wrap or clear sheet protectors as tightly as possible on the inside of the box across the opening you cut in the lid. This will allow the air inside the box to heat up but keep the heat trapped inside the box.



4. Glue black construction paper to the bottom of the box. The black color will absorb the heat.



5. Break graham crackers in half to make squares. Place four squares in the solar oven and place a marshmallow on each.



- Note: It takes the marshmallow longer to melt than the chocolate, so first we'll melt the marshmallow and then add the chocolate on top.
- **6.** Close the oven lid (the part with the plastic wrap on it) tightly, and tape a wooden stick to prop up the oven door flap.



- 7. Set your oven outside in the direct sun, the open flap will reflect the light into the box.
- 8. Depending on how hot the day is, and how directly the sunlight shines on the oven, the marshmallows will take 30 to 60 minutes to get squishy when you poke them.
- 9. When marshmallows are squishy, open the oven lid and place a piece of chocolate (about half the size of the graham cracker square) on top of each marshmallow. Place another graham cracker on top of the chocolate and press down gently to squash the marshmallow.
- **10.** Close the lid of the solar oven and let the sun heat it up for a few minutes more, just to melt the chocolate a bit.
- **11.** Enjoy your tasty treat!

Setup:

(for parents)

Before you begin, have your parents help you set up 5 chairs back to back. Print and cut out the challenge cards. Tape one or two challenge cards to the back of each chair. Once your chairs, and are all set up, make sure you have the music track downloaded and you'll be ready to go!

Twizzler Pictionary

20 Minutes



Instructions:

- **1.** Cut out the pictionary playing cards.
- **2.** Shuffle the cards and place them face down in one pile.
- 3. Pick a playing card, read what it says, and set the timer for 1 minute. Don't show the card you picked to anyone.
- **4.** On a blank sheet of paper, use Twizzlers to shape a picture of the word on the playing card you picked.

Play with a partner:

- a. Your partner will try to guess what picture you are shaping before the timer rings. If they guess correctly, you earn 1 point. If they don't guess correctly, you earn zero points.

Kotel Coffee Art

② 25 Minutes



Instructions:

1. Mix your different amounts of coffee with water in the cups. For the light shade of brown mix 1 teaspoon coffee with ¼ cup water. For the medium brown mix 2 teaspoons coffee and ¼ cup water. For the dark brown mix 3 teaspoons coffee and ¼ cup water and for the very dark brown 3 teaspoons coffee and one teaspoon water.

- **2.** Place each cup on its right place on the measurement mat
- 3. Tape your paper to the surface so it does not move while you are doing your craft. On your paper use the ruler and pencil to mark a line towards the bottom of the page that will divide the ground from the kotel.(you can also use the ruler to make the lines of your kotel.)
- **4.** Take the light brown color and paint the background of the kotel then take the dark brown and paint the ground.



5. Take the very brown dark and paint the lines of the layers of stone on the kotel with your thin brush horizontally (make sure to draw a line of stone that will divide the ground from the kotel.



6. Then with the same color and brush draw vertical lines up the page to make the stones, make sure to stagger the stones!



- **7.** Take the medium brown and shade in your stones.
- 8. Next we are going to create the small bushes that are popping out of the kotel. To do this we are going to take the very dark mixture and our thin brush and make some swooping lines going outward and downward coming out of some of the stones.
- 9. To make the people, use the small brush and the very dark coffee paint. Draw figure like ovals at different points of the ground to create the people closer and farther away from the kotel



10. Let it dry and then hang up your masterpiece!

Mezuzah/Tefillin Rice Krispie Treats

Instructions:

In a bowl mix the rice krispies and marshmallow fluff together.

Mezuzah:

- **1.** Shape the rice krispies into a long rectangle.
- Using your knife carefully cut the fruit by the foot in the shape of the letter Shin v and place it at the top of the rectangle.
- 3. We got a mezuzah now!

Tefillin:
